Updates from the Community Support Hub

Local COVID Alert Level "Medium" - West Berkshire continues to be in the "Medium" Level in the new three tier system for local restrictions in England. This means we must adhere to the rule of 6, work from home where we can, and continue to **follow the national COVID-19 guidance.**

Further areas in England have gone into the "High" or

"Very High" alert levels, due to rises in COVID-19 cases. A full list of these areas can be found here.

We do continue to see a rise in cases in West Berkshire and we all must continue to play our part, remembering Hands Face and Space, and self-isolating and requesting a test if we have symptoms. Crucially we must also self-isolate for the full amount of time we are instructed to, including if identified as a close contact of someone who has tested positive.



The Council is continuing to work tirelessly to support residents, businesses and visitors during the pandemic. The Local Engagement Board Meeting (Public) held Friday, 23 October 10.00 provided an update on the Covid-19 situation in West Berkshire. The draft minutes will be posted here as soon as they are available.

Public Events Guidance - Staying Safe - Halloween, Guy Fawkes, Remembrance Sunday and Diwali are almost upon us, but like many things this year adjustments will need to be made to ensure that we're keeping safe and following Covid-19 rules and guidance.

Free vaccine for eligible groups People most at risk from the complications of flu are recommended to get a flu vaccine every year. This winter it is especially important with flu and Covid-19 both in circulation. Research shows that if you get both at the same time you may be more seriously ill.

Due to high demand for the flu vaccine, there may be some delays getting a vaccination appointment. Your GP surgery or pharmacy should be able to tell you when more appointments are available.

If you are eligible for the free flu vaccine, you may get it either from your own GP practice or any pharmacy offering NHS flu vaccinations. The NHS website explains in further detail who is eligible for a FREE flu vaccine.

Playing West Berkshire Lottery supports good causes



The <u>West Berkshire Lottery</u> celebrates its fourth £2,000 winner of 2020 as well as 23 lucky £250 winners. That brings the total winnings paid out to more than £80,000 since the West Berkshire Lottery launched in 2019!

Out of every £1 ticket purchased, 50p goes directly to the lottery player's chosen charity and 10p goes into the Council's good cause fund. More than £92,000 has been paid out in funds to good causes so far. There are 125 local good causes signed up as recipients of West Berkshire Lottery ticket sale proceeds, with almost 1,030

residents currently supporting the lottery each week.

Each ticket has a 1 in 50 chance to win a prize in the weekly draw at 8pm. The winnings range from free tickets to the top prize of £25,000 and being in the draw on the 31st October also means entry into a national-draw for a Staycation with Forest Holidays.

REMINDER: Is there someone you would like to nominate to receive a gift from the West Berkshire Community Santa?

The Community Santa deadline for nominations for gifts is Monday, 9th November.

This year has been difficult for so many of us but some local people have been particularly impacted by Covid-19. For this reason, West Berkshire Council is organising a "Community Santa" gift giving project to let those who are struggling know that others are thinking of them. Once the project has formally launched in mid November, residents will be able to go to a confidential online platform to select an anonymous person for whom they will then buy a gift.



Before the online platform goes live, we need nominations for people to receive the gifts and volunteers to distribute them. So we're calling on YOU - the very groups who have been supporting your neighbours through this difficult time - to nominate someone in your community who would benefit from a special treat this festive season. Perhaps you know someone who has been self-isolating alone for a long period of time, or someone who has lost a loved-one recently. Maybe you know a family who have been experiencing unemployment as a result of the current situation or someone whose mental health has suffered during lockdown.

Following your nominations, an anonymous description of the nominee (age/gender) will be posted on the Community Santa gift-giving site. Residents will be invited to visit this confidential platform to let us know who they'd like to purchase a gift for, and then drop off the gift they buy at designated collection points.

If you feel someone of any age/gender/faith in your town or village is having a difficult time and deserves a treat, and you are willing to be responsible for distributing the gift purchased by a resident, please email your nominations to communitysanta@westberks.gov.uk and we'll do the rest. Please do NOT include any personal details such as name or address – we only need to know the age and gender (male/female/not specified) of each recipient, and contact details for the group. Deadline: Monday, 9th November.
