I—AIMS

The name of the Institute is "The Women's Institute" (hereinafter referred to as "the Institute").

II—AIMS AND OBJECTS

The main purpose of the Institute is to improve and develop conditions of rural life.

For the purpose of securing and furthering the said object the Institute shall have power to:—

- (1) Provide a centre for educational and social intercourse and activities.
- (2) Stimulate interest in agricultural pursuits.
- (3) Give instruction and training in and study domestic science, hygiene and social welfare.
- (4) Give instruction and training in and encourage home handicrafts.
- (5) Develop co-operative enterprise.
- (6) Give instruction in and study domestic and rural economics.
- (7) Receive and apply in and towards any of the above objects, and not otherwise, grants and other funds provided and sanctioned by the National Federation of Women's Institutes of England and Wales (hereinafter referred to as "the National Federation").
- (8) Buy on behalf of all or any of the members any commodity approved by the Committee, and distribute and allot the same either gratuitously or at cost.
- (9) Do such other things as may be incidental or conducive to the attainment of the purpose of the Institute.

III—CONSTITUTION

- (a) A Women's Institute is an association of women formed in accordance with the form of Constitution and Rules laid down for Women's Institutes by the Annual Meeting of the National Federation.

The Apologies for absence, and minutes of last meeting ~~discussed~~ were read and the following subjects discussed.

The president said that 10 Hyacinth Bulbs had been sent to the Institute from the County Sec: These had to be grown by members of the Institute for competition and would be judged in March; as it was rather late for planting, and would be 3 weeks later if left for distribution at the next monthly meeting; it was arranged that 10 members of the Committee should grow them.

It was arranged that Miss Havelock should arrange the tea for the Dec: meeting and that tea should be given to chauffers.

Mr. Edwards and Miss Staples were left to arrange the cards for the next meeting.

The following names, of new members, were then placed before the Committee for election; Mr. Green, Mr. Cruise, and Mr. Weston. These were proposed, seconded, and carried, and the Secretary was instructed to write and inform them that they had been elected members of the Institute, with the date, time, and place, of the next monthly meeting.

After the Apologies for absence and minutes were read; the following business was discussed.

The president said that we were finding it difficult to get obtain a Demonstrator for Quilting and were awaiting a reply from the Hampshire Secretary, and she proposed that the committee should leave this to be arranged by the president and secretary, this proposal was unanimously agreed to.

A letter was then passed round from the County Secretary, reminding us of the Annual County meeting at Reading on Jan 24th and requesting all Institutes to send a Delegate. The Committee then elected Miss Lawrence to represent

HINTS ON BANNER DESIGNING.

DESIGN

Banners should be designed on the same lines as posters, namely, in broad masses of colour, eliminating detail and, most important of all, good clear lettering.

MATERIALS

The best material to use throughout for a banner is linen. The linen used should be fadeless and of the heavy quality that is generally obtainable from good soft furnishing shops.

SIZE

As banners are often used out-of-doors or in large halls, they should be of a good size, namely - not less than 2 feet 6 ins. wide, by 5½ to 4 feet in depth.

METHOD

Appliquéd work is the best possible method for all banner work. Fine embroidery stitches should be avoided.

MAKING UP

When the front of the banner is completed it should be carefully damped on the back only and stretched till quite dry. The lining should then also be stretched in the same way. The lining should first be attached to the top of the banner and then the banner should be left hanging by the upper edge for some days - this is to ensure that it is fully stretched and, therefore, will not give further when in use. The sides and lower edge of the lining should be slip-stitched to the banner while it is in a hanging position,

GROUP RULES.

1. Group Meetings should be held at least once a year, the meetings being open to all W.I.s in the Group.
2. Each Group should hold at least two Committee Meetings during the year. This Committee to consist of the Presidents, Vice Presidents, Secretaries, and Treasurers of each W.I. in the Group, also the V.C.O. attached to each district in which the Group is situated.
3. The Group Officers should consist of Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer. The offices of Treasurer and Secretary may be held by the same person. These Officers to be elected annually by this Committee as soon as possible after the Annual Meeting of each W.I. in the Group.
4. Groups should make every effort to be self-supporting by voluntary efforts, such as profits on teas, etc. A levy on Institutes is not permitted. In the event of any successful money-making effort being made, any large surplus should be handed to the County Federation.
5. Groups have no power to pass Resolutions; they can make recommendation to the Executive Committee of the County Federation. These recommendations will be warmly welcomed.
6. Group Secretaries will be invited to attend Meetings of the Organisation sub-committee of the County Federation four times a year. Travelling expenses to such meetings will be paid out of County Funds.
7. All changes of Group officers must be reported as soon as possible to the County Secretary of the Berkshire Federation.

Group Competitions.

In arranging Competitions, such as "something new out of something old", or other handicraft competitions, would you always make it quite clear that the work must be done by the member competing.
