 called middle hyscroft & lower hyscroft after the said Thomas Carrard and
 William Carrard shall attayne unto the said full age of two and twenty
 yeres my will is that the same remaine for & towards the better breeding &
 maintenance & livelihood of my said grandchild Robert Carrard. Item I
 give unto my other grandchild Doroteia Carrard Henry Carrard John
 Carrard and Bridget Carrard the younger children of my said daughter
 Doroteia Carrard to each of them of the said portions to be paid unto my said
 children when they shall be sixteen yeres of age after my decease to be employed by
 them for the best good of my said grandchild Doroteia according as they in their
 discretion shall see expedient and I give unto my said daughter Doroteia
 after Joane if she shall live my whole estate of my decease & goods & my
 of the value of xxx. And unto William Webb my nephew brother of the
 goods & my of the value of xxx. And unto his wife a pair of gloves of gold
 & silver price of xx. And unto the three daughters of my daughter
 Christopher to each of them twenty shillings & I give unto my nephew
 Nicholas Bamster of London glazier and unto his wife and unto my
 nephew Robert Butler to each of them a pair of gloves of gold & silver
 & I give unto Francis Goddard somtymes my trustie a summe of
 twenty shillings & I give unto the children of my son Thomas George Lott
 of Buttermore in the County of Wilts. the last gilt year of the
 of one of my cows in Buttermore being four yeres of age & I give
 George the said father shall well and truly pay unto me or my executor
 all the other rents due unto me and not otherwise than I have received
 gilt acre of meadowe in Longwittenham before mentioned & occupied
 called Lamp gilt acre & give & bequeath the same to the poor of the
 parish of Longwittenham forever. But it is my will & mourning that
 the parties that shall dwell in my house in Longwittenham for the
 time being shall have and receive the grass and hay of the said gilt
 acre yearly and shall yearly pay for the same one bushell of wheat
 & shall be baked by them the said parties the said dwelling into 2 loaves
 of bread for each as it will extend and yearly distributed amongst the
 said poor of the said parish at Easter Eve at my said dwelling house
 by the said person or persons there dwelling. All the rest of my goods &
 chattels not formerly bequeathed I give and bequeath unto my said eldest
 daughter Doroteia Carrard whom I make the sole executrix of this my
 last will and testament. And I do request and beseech my loving friends
 and friends John Cotton of Lynnhorsent gent. John Wylster of the City
 of London and Hugh Wylster of Hatcombe Glouc. to be my executors of this my
 last will. And I give unto each of them a pair of gloves of gold & silver
 price of xx. And I do hereby revoke all former wills in
 writing made by me & have caused this my last will and testament consisting
 of these sheets of paper filed together to be read and published and
 have hereto set my hand and seal the day and year first above
