

Sidney Tubb 1879-1915

Sidney Tubb was born about 1879, the youngest son of Mrs J Tubb of Park Street, Hungerford. He was married to Laura (nee Abraham) of Inkpen, and they had two young children, Francis Sidney and Edwin Raymond. For some years he had been an auxiliary postman between Inkpen and Hungerford, living in Inkpen Common.

He enlisted at Newbury and went to France on 11th August 1915 as a private in the Royal Army Medical Corps.

Sidney Tubb was killed in action on Tuesday 28th December 1915, age 37.

He is buried at Noeux-Les-Mines Communal cemetery, Pas de Calais, France.
