A chales w^t the paten of sylver percell gilte weing xiiij ounces two corporouse w^t cases thone of grene veluett brodered w^t gold thother of yellowe Sylke a Canopy and pyxe of latten couered w^t yellowe clothe, a pax of brasse, a oyle vate of pewter two cruettes of ledd, a Saynsor of brasse a haly-water pott of brasse, two awlter clothes of diaper, iij of lockeram, iij towelles of lockeram, a Coope of redd and grene Satten broudered withe flowers of goulde, a vestymente of redd and greene Damaske broudered w^t flowers of goulde w^t thappurtenances albe and amys of lockeram, a nother old vestymente of saten of bridges white and redd w^t the appurtenaunce albe and amys of lockeram, a Surplice of lockeram, thre awlter clothes of redd and yellowe lockeram stayned a lent Clothe of lockeram a clothe to hange before the tablemente ^a, at the hedd awlter of Dornixe twoo streamers, iij old banners of lockeram paynted, twoo candlestickes of brasse, a crosse of laten gilte three lytell belles hanging in the steple by estymatyon xxx^o weight, the corse belle and a sakaring belle. And all the saide percelles safely to be kepte &c.
