Who being sworn and charged to enquire of and
 concerning divers Articles Cognizable in this Court present as follows (to wit)

The Homage aforesaid present as follows

- In the first place They present and Avow every Tenant belonging to
 this Manner who did not appear or Show at this Court being duly
 also - They present that none of the Inhabitants of this Manner
 any Turf or Speale in any of the Commons within this Manner without
 the Licence from the Lord thereof under the penalty of five pounds
 a Cart Load and a proportionable Summe for every Wheelbarrow full or any
 other Quantity Conveyed in what manner soever either more or less than
 a Load to be paid to the said Lord and the like penalty upon those
 that carry the same away
- also They present that no person in this Manner shall cut any fagg
 in any of the Commons of this Manner to be burnt out of the parish
 or in any Hill within this parish under the penalty of Twenty
 Shillings each Load and so in proportion for any greater or less
 Quantity to be paid by the person who cuts the same to the said
 Lord and the like on those who carry the same away

100 a Log of Spruce in the Commons of this Maner being the same
in a Timber being Contrary to an Order made at the last Court hold for
this Maner.

also - They present that none of the Inhabitants within this Maner
shall Inclose any of the Waste or Commonable Land within this
Maner without Licence of the said Lord on penalty of Twenty
Shillings per pole to be paid to the said Lord.

also - They present that no person shall put any Stone horse into the Commons
or any horse Infected with the Mangle or any other Infection
Distemper under the penalty of Twenty Shillings to be paid to the
said Lord.

also - They present that no person shall digg Sand to Carry out of this
Maner under the penalty of Twenty Shillings each Load to be paid
to the said Lord.

also - They present Gabriel Fidler for Erecting a Cottage on the Lords
Waste within this Maner and order him to pull the same down on
or before Whitsun next under the penalty of five pounds to be paid
to the said Lord.

also - They present William Buckridge for Erecting a Cottage on the
Lords Waste within this Maner and order him to pull the same down
on or before Whitsun next under the penalty of five pounds to
be paid to the said Lord.

also - They elect James Knight Snyward for this Maner for the year
 ensuing and order for his Wages Six pence each Cow or Horse One
 Shilling a Stone or more for Sheep that he shall pound belonging
 to this Maner and Double the penalties above for such Cattle that
 he shall Impound belonging to any person that is not an Inhabitant
