Proved at London 8th Jan 9 1833 before the Worshipful John Daggard J^r of Law & Esquire by the oath of Thomas Vincent the sole executor to whom a commission was granted limited so far as concerns a certain leasehold public house called the Half Way House between St. Pauls Church and St. Dunstons Buildings Churchbridge and any undivided moiety of the houses Nos 56, 57 and 58 in Saint Thomas Street Parish in the County of Middlesex and other the estate and effects comprised in the residue of the estate and effects of Anne Vincent widow deceased and the profits proceeds and accumulations herefrom arising until she the testatrix has power to dispose of by the will of the said Anne Vincent deceased and that disposed of accordingly but no further or otherwise the having been first sworn duly to administer.

of me Edward Varnish of the city of Norwich Gent^l of the parish and hamlet of St. Andrew's being of sound mind and every way fit to make this my last will first I nominate Mary my wife and Edward my son executor and executor of this my last will severally I do bequeath to my son one share of the Norwich Union fire office one share of the Norwich and Norwich joint stock banking Company two shares of the Norwich and Norwich Navigation Company and five shares of the Drinningham Water Works Company my brother Benjamin Varnish fifty two pounds a year for his life and to my sister Elizabeth Taylor twenty six pounds a year for her life to be paid to my wife Elizabeth Taylor and to my wife Mary Varnish I bequeath one hundred and five pounds a year for her life and the house we now live in No 12 St. Andrew's place with the furniture plate linen &c &c my son paying all repairs and expenses and likewise all my funeral expenses so that my wife may have a share one hundred and five pounds a year for her life but if my son should die before my wife not having lawful issue then I bequeath to my sister Elizabeth Taylor one hundred a year being her life & the remainder of my property to remain to my brother Benjamin Varnish paying my nephew Henry Varnish one hundred pounds his sister having the same and so finally I leave my son residuary legatee and I revoke all former and other wills by me at any time heretofore made and do declare this about to be my last will and testament sheweth whereof I the said Edward Varnish have set my hand and seal this seventeenth day of October 1830 witnesses my hand and seal. of property also any money which may be in my bankers hands or elsewhere after paying my
just debts and the legacies specified as above & some trifling remembrances to friends I am now
about to mention viz to Dr D. Watson a handsome mourning ring to his daughter Miss M
Watson a handsome mourning ring and to my very dear & much esteemed friend Dr W
Dunster wife of Dr Genl Dunster of Dept Lodge the three water coloured views of Dr
Dunster's Lodge and a handsome mourning ring to Elizabeth Sauby wife of the Revd Geo
Sauby Junr a ring value ten pounds or any thing else she may prefer to wear in remem-
brance of me and I further give to my wife & Goddaughter Maria Sauby all my plate

otherwise disposed of and hoping I have so plainly & fully expressed my intentions and
wishes that they must be clearly understood & wishing to avoid the possibility of giving or
