 annual produce of all my Sums of Money already
 placed out or that shall be placed out on any Security
 whatsoever whether in the funds or Bond or Annuitie
 shall be subject to such payment that she may have
 the full and sole enjoyment of it during her life
 the residue after she has been paid her Annuitie of
 seven hundred pounds I desire may be equally divided
 by my two sons and whatever Money may be due
 to me or in my possession at the time of my decease
 I desire it may be placed in the funds or some other
 Security as soon as possible excepting the sum of three
 hundred pounds which I would have her receive for her
 own immediate use and convenience I likewise bequeath
 to her all my furniture plate Goods &c. &c.
