said County of Bucks and to one acre of land in a Common field
there called the Middle Field for Ninety and nine years or an
undeterminable upon the respective deceases of my wife Sarah.

 give and devise all and singular the same promises unto the said
 Sarah Bartholomew now my wife for so many years of the said
 term as shall expire in the time of her natural life and from a

 of them for and during all the residue of the same term then
 give to the said Sarah my wife the use of all my household
 goods during her natural life and from and after her death to
 give all the same household goods unto the said Henry Hayes
 then to give to my said wife the sum of five pounds of lawful
 money of Great Britain to my late Mary Knowles sister
 of the said Elizabeth Hayes and daughter of William Knowles
 of Housington in the County of Middlesex to another the sum of
 ten pounds of like lawful money and to Thomas Bartholomew
 Edmund Bartholomew and Elizabeth now the wife of John a
 faithfull friend of the children of my Consin Henry Bartholomew
 the sum of three pounds apiece of like lawful money all a
 which several sums of money (except the said five pounds)
 shall be paid within two years but the said five pounds a
 within three months next after my death then give to a
 Richard Hayes another son of the said William Hayes the a
 bove the sum of ten pounds of like lawful money to be paid
 within three years next after my death all the residue of
 my money goods and chattels my debts being paid and
 funeral expences discharged I give and bequeath unto the
 said Henry Hayes whome I make sole Executor of this my a
 last will and Testament and £100 hereby bequeath to all former
 debts and Testaments by me made and declared in writing
 whereof I the said Thomas Bartholomew the Testator have
 hereunto set my hand and seal the third day of June in the
 year of our Lord God One thousand seven hundred and
 Eight. Thomas Bartholomew, signe so alde published and
