unto Robert Gelling to shopp, unto Dunliffe Kemp to shopp, unto Francis W. Dely to shopp  
unto Ann Knight to shopp, the residue of all my goodes whatsoeuer not before given and bequeathsd  
my legacies paid and my funerall discharged I give unto my brother-in-law Thomas Deward to spend  
I make my full and whole executor of this my last will and testament, In witness whereof I sett  
my hand Thomas Tailor, I make my Master in Richard Young and William Sharpes my elder  
Counsailes to see my will performed

worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless mee with I dispose  
thereof as followeth, Item I bequeath unto my brother John and sister  
Margaret Gilbert the summe of fiftie shillings to be paid unto my  
lovinge wife Jane Gilbert in the Parish of Malden in the County of  
Surrey and unto the summe of Tenne poundsd current English money  
to be payed by my Executors hereafter named but in case she should  
happen to be dead before this my will come to be proved then my desire is  
that that monye soe given maye be equally divided betwixt my Brother  
and sister John and Margaret as aforesaid, Item I make William Deward  
of the same ship the value of fiftie poundsd of Eight in Oble with I have  
in the hands of John Briggs my Master made in the same ship  
cominge from India Item I bequeath unto my Cousin Thomas Comblings two  
pieces of Oble to be delivred unto my wife as a token of my love
